Cyclone Hudhud Pounds India

In India, and post Hudhud Cyclone after effects, the staff can wash the clothes that are left after the storm, but to rebuild the roof of the orphanage, clean up the debris, replace the water damaged beds and other furniture, and to replace the kitchen—all of those are major needs.

Also, affected by this storm were several of our COGOP ministry churches and Pastors of the Vizag District—Vizianagaram, Srikakulam Kakinada

and District Overseer Bishop Zaccaus. Some of our churches were badly damaged and our church believers have no essential commodities.

Here in this area, we have 15 churches working in behalf of our ministry. Tops of some of the Church buildings were damaged; Iron sheets, tiles and thatch were thrown away by this cyclone.

Our church believers lost their boats and also other means of transportation during this storm.

So I kindly request you to pray for them and help them. Thank you.,

Northeast India—Bena Project Proposal

North India actually has a new government there, and it looks like it is going to be interesting to see how this effects the church work in India. This area has been getting more and more hostile to the Gospel. It may soon be a closed nation if things keep going like they are. Please help us pray about this.

The thing that makes the Bena project so important is that we have had to move our orphanage children from Delhi to Manipur for safety reasons already. We now need to have a permanent place for the children to be housed, schooled, and especially be safe.

The Bena property would serve us to build a multipurpose facility which will help us tremendously in North India ministry. We have 24 COGOP churches in the area of Manipur [where the Bena project is located] who will also be able to access and directly benefit from this project.

We already are running a school in Bena village one mile away from the donated land with sixty children. Presently, we are in an abandoned school building that is being provided by the villagers. Since the school building is in a very bad condition it needs to be upgraded

to give birth to the bigger project. The villagers have generously donated 20 acres of Land for the Bena School Project and any other Ministerial Projects in the future.

Apart from being an economic backward district, this region has been destroyed by inter-Tribal war and militant insurgency, along with drugs and HIV problems. After much study and prayer, I came to the conclusion that only the Gospel and education will bring freedom to this region.
